I will explore, but I need some time for the miners to work the black earth before setting sail back home before September. If I am fortunate, perhaps someone will name a bay after me.

## News Notes

The several sections of the News Notes Department include brief reports of events, new programs, publications, education and training opportunities, accessions and openings, historical editing projects, and other news of professional interest to members of the Society.

The reporters listed below have furnished much of the information for this department. In addition, News Notes have been abstracted from publicity releases and newsletters sent to *The American Archivist* and to the National Archives Library. More current information about training opportunities, professional meetings, and legislation can be found in the *S.A.A. Newsletter*.

The **American Institute of Physics, Center for History of Physics**, has been working for years on the serious problem of preserving the historical records of the great laboratories which have grown up in the United States since the 1940s. Spot checks sponsored by the institute show that much needs to be done, both directly to preserve the material and indirectly by making recommendations to record keeping and archival agencies. One project, concentrating on Department of Energy contract laboratories and conducted in cooperation with the department and the National Archives and Records Service, has made substantial progress. For this project, the institute received a National Science Foundation grant for a one-year pilot program to compile an administrative history, study record-keeping

procedures, and survey records at the Brookhaven National Laboratory. The work is overseen by an Advisory Committee on the Documentation of Post-War Science comprising seven experienced archivists and records managers and seven scholars from various fields. The center is trying to extend the pilot study to several other laboratories. During the past year, three other Department of Energy laboratories, the Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory, the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory, and the Lawrence Livermore Laboratory, have initiated history projects with the assistance of the American Institute of Physics.

Two librarians in **Birmingham, Alabama**, while surveying unidentified city records, discovered material dating from

1940 to 1963, which had been packed away when the city changed its form of government. Contained in these records are extensive data on the city's opposition to the civil rights movement, including transcripts of telephone conversations of Martin Luther King, while he was imprisoned in the city jail.

The **Society of California Archivists** has chosen basic conservation as the theme of its fall workshop at the Huntington Library on September 30.

More than sixty members attended the seventh annual meeting of the society, held in Redland on April 7 and 8. A major session on appraisal was held at which everything from retrieving valued documents from wastebaskets to sampling and spot collecting was discussed. The business meeting included a thorough discussion of archival security programs and particularly the California laws relevant to the protection of archival and manuscript material.

On June 12 the **Chicago Public Library** mounted an exhibition of material acquired between 1974 and 1978 relating to the Civil War and Chicago history. The exhibit includes manuscripts, books, broadsides, photographs, and maps. Among the works chosen for display is "An Answer to the Declaration of the American Congress," British Royalist John Lind's rebuttal to the Declaration of Independence. Closing date for the exhibit was set for October 25.

The **General Electric Company** has begun a project to preserve historical material particularly related to the scientific and technological aspects of the company's work. The company intends both to make its own material available and to accession material held by private individuals.

In late May, fire destroyed the film and photograph collection of the **George Eastman House International Museum of Photography**. Much of the film was original, or early prints of films made when movies first became commercially successful. Copies exist elsewhere of most of the destroyed films.

The **General Assembly, state of Iowa**, recently appropriated \$20,000 to the State

Historical Department to establish the position of state archivist, beginning July 1, 1978. Resulting in part from the efforts of the Iowa Historical Materials Preservation Society, with support from SAA and the Midwest Archives Conference, the Historical Department hired F. Gerald Ham, state archivist of Wisconsin, as a consultant under a grant from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission. A second NHPRC grant for the employment of an assistant state archivist was contingent on the appointment of a professional state archivist.

Walter W. Ristow, chief of the Geography and Map Division of the **Library of Congress**, retired on April 28. Ristow spent thirty-one years at the Library of Congress and is an authority in geography, cartography, and map librarianship. SAA member Norman J. Shaffer has been named to head the library's Preservation Office. He has recently served as program officer of the National Preservation Program.

The **Louisiana State Museum** is presenting two special exhibits, Louisiana's Black Heritage, and Amistad III. The Black Heritage exhibit includes artifacts, paintings, prints, documents, and photographs exploring such topics as slavery and the slave trade, free Blacks in the arts and the militia, Blacks in the Civil War, Reconstruction, segregation, and civil rights. The Amistad III exhibit, organized with the cooperation of Dillard University, presents works of art by black Louisiana artists from 1790 to 1975.

The **Society of Mississippi Archivists** recently met, adopted a constitution, and elected officers. The society elected as president Claude E. Fiske, university archivist at the University of Southern Mississippi; as vice president Sammy Cranford, university archivist at Delta State University; as secretary/executive director Ronald E. Tomlin, Mississippi Department of Archives and History; and as treasurer, Anne Wells, manuscript librarian at Mississippi State University.

Among the major holdings of the **Montana Historical Society** are the Thomas C. Powers Papers and the Samuel T. Hauser Papers. Both Powers and Hauser

were central figures in early Montana, building business empires in the key areas of banking, merchandising, ranching, and mining. They were also deeply involved in territorial and state politics. The collections document nearly every phase of Montana's economy and politics during the period of the 1860s to the 1920s.

Archivists on the staff of the **National Archives and Records Service** have been working on the presidential and pre-presidential materials of Richard Nixon. The pre-presidential material has been screened and is being sent to the federal archives and records center at Laguna Niguel, California. The White House tapes are being rewound on bigger reels to stabilize winding tension. Concurrently they are being duplicated, both for working purposes and for security. They are also being checked to determine whether a signal is present or absent on all parts of the tapes. No tapes are being listened to.

As part of its expanding educational program, the National Archives has organized a national traveling exhibition of maps, charts, drawings, watercolors, manuscripts, and cartographic instruments that depict the development of this nation from 1769 to the present. The exhibition, titled "Taking the Measure of the Land," has been scheduled to be shown in Minneapolis, Austin, Chicago, Dallas, Seattle, and other cities.

The eighteenth annual National Archives Conference, September 21-22, is entitled "The Law and American Society: New Historical Perspectives and Resources." Among topics announced in advance were the law and Black protest, female crime, legal biography, and privacy issues in the use of legal records.

The **Old Slave Mart Museum** in Charleston, South Carolina, occupies a building built in 1851 to house a slave market operated by Thomas Ryan. Included in the collection of the museum, in addition to the items like slave tags and cuffs, are many of the original records of the transactions.

The **Sheen Archives** at St. Bernard's Seminary Library, Rochester, New York, has completed the preliminary arrangement of its second major accession of the papers of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen.

These manuscripts, articles, and newspaper clippings date from 1925.

At the business meeting of the **Society of Tennessee Archivists**, in March, the membership voted to award a \$50 scholarship to a member for the purposes of attending the Basic Workshop on the Care of Historical Records, to be held October 1-6, or the SAA annual meeting. Any member of the Tennessee Archivists who holds a junior archival position, or who is new in the profession, is eligible for this award.

The society held its spring meeting, March 30-31. Among session topics at the meeting were the Society of American Archivists, social history, and the uses of SPINDEX.

The state of Utah has awarded Jay M. Haymond, coordinator of collections and preservation with the **Division of State History**, its 1977 Earl Conder Distinguished Employee Award. Haymond has coordinated the state's oral history programs, initiated workshops, and helped establish local historical societies throughout the state.

Randall to Lieutenant Richard Bache, recounting Randall's experiences and observations in the Corps of Artillery, the courts, and the diplomatic service; letters (November 1918-January 1919) of Mortimer DeGroot, who served in the Graves Registration Command in France; and the papers of General John E. Dahlquist, covering his career (1917-56), especially his command of the Thirty-sixth Infantry Division (1944-45).

**Auburn University Archives**. Accessions: records (1929-74) of the Alabama Art League; records, films, and photographs (1932-72) from the Auburn University Athletic Department; records (1940-73) of the Holy Trinity Episcopal Church of Auburn; photographs (1953-74) from the *Auburn Bulletin*; records (1950-73) of the Civitan Club of Auburn; papers and diaries (1917-56) of Frank Ashton Clark, former Auburn student and World War I veteran, including

war correspondence; photographs (1956–76) and records (1902–59) from the *Opelika-Auburn News*; papers (1870–1977) of Fred Allison, physicist and Auburn professor; papers (1894–1977) of the Bowling family, including notebooks and diaries of Congressman William B. Bowling of Alabama (1920–28); records (1939–70) of the Delta Kappa Gamma sorority; and architectural drawings of the Chattahoochee Commission Endangered Valley Structures Committee.

**Leo Baeck Institute.** Accessions: collection of David Baumgardt (1890–1963), philosophy professor at the University of Berlin and consultant in philosophy to the Library of Congress, including book and essay manuscripts, clippings about and minutes of the Zionist organization Hapoel Hazair, and letters from prominent European and American intellectuals; papers of Erich Muehsam (1878–1934), author, socialist, and anarchist, including personal and family correspondence of Muehsam and his wife Zenl, née Elfinger, and literary manuscripts; papers (1838–1915) of Siegfried S. Muehsam, grandfather of Erich and pharmacist in Lübeck; collection of Siegfried Guggenheim (1873–1961), lawyer and notary in Offenbach/Main, who emigrated to the United States and died in New York, including three generations of Guggenheim family correspondence, manuscripts of articles, professional papers concerning his work in the law firm of Otto von Brentano, material about Jewish refugees in Chile (1942–58), and personal correspondence; papers of Johannes Urzidil (1896–1970), essayist, poet, novelist, and his wife (1898–1977), née Thieberger, who were involved in Prague's golden age of literature and counted among their friends Franz Kafka, Max Brod, Franz Werfel, and Thomas Mann; papers of Friedrich Bill (1894–76), Austrian-Czech Social Democrat, lawyer, and journalist; and the Heilner Family Collection (1853–1921) concerning the Heilner family, of Bavaria, and family members who immigrated to California and Oregon in 1853.

**California Institute of Technology Archives.** Accessions: papers (principally 1971–76) of biophysicist Robert L. Sinsheimer (1920–) relating to the recombinant DNA controversy; notes

(1925–40) taken by Charles Richter of courses taught by Paul Epstein (1883–1966).

**Chicago Historical Society.** Accessions: papers of Kenesaw Mountain Landis (1866–1944), attorney, U.S. District Court judge, and commissioner of baseball; papers of Frances Crane Lillie and other members of the Crane and Lillie families; papers of James P. **University of Iowa Libraries.** Accessions: papers of Mary Louise Smith, former national chairman of the Republican Party (September 1947–January 1977); papers (1852–1927) of Charles Wood Irish, a civil engineer from Iowa City who was involved in the first attempt to build a railroad across Iowa in the 1850s; and papers (1913–49) of Arthur Francis Allen, documenting his career as editor of the *Sioux City Journal*.

**Kansas State Historical Society.** Accession: the drawings and photographs of Santa Fe Railway motive power and rolling stock collected by Frank M. Ellington of Colfax, Iowa. Ellington, author of railroad publications, will release portions of his collection over a period of time as he finishes using them in the production of his books. Part of the collection has been transferred to Topeka already, and eventually approximately 250 drawings and 1,000 photographs will be available for research in the Manuscript Department at the Memorial Building.

**Minnesota Historical Society.** Accession: photograph collection (1912–16) taken by William F. Roleff, of logging camps in northern Minnesota.

**University of Nebraska** at Lincoln, Library, Archives, and Special Collections Division. Accession: Benjamin A. Botkin Folklore Collection, consisting of the papers of the folklorist Benjamin A. Botkin and his personal library of some 8,000 volumes and hundreds of tape recordings and phonograph records. The collection documents the various aspects of Botkin's work including the West, the Civil War, the Mississippi River, New England, the Negro, and New York City. His papers include scrapbooks, notebooks, and extensive research notes for and manuscripts of his published and unpublished books and articles. There are thousands of letters exchanged between Botkin and other folklorists and scholars in literature, history, music, education, and publishing.

**Nebraska State Historical Society.** Accessions: dockets and bills of exception (1868–ca.1950) of the Saunders County District Court; naturalization records (1873–1942) and probate records (1870–1960) of York County. Microfilm: school census (1860–1977) of Cass County.

**Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission,** Division of Archives and Manuscripts. Accessions: contracts, petitions, examiner's reports (1931–33) of the Department of State relating to the introduction of voting machines in Pennsylvania; Constitution of 1873 (original copy) received from the Department of State; minutes (1911–62) and medical license books (1894–1904) of the State Board of Medical Education and Licensure; dental license books (1894–1973) of the State Dental Council and Board of Examiners; minutes (1919–62) of the State Board of Examiners of Architects; minutes (1940–62) of the Bureau of Professional Licensing, Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners; minutes (1909–77) and registration of nurses (1909–25) of the State Board of Examiners for Registration of Nurses; mine fire investigation files (1968–72) of the Department of Environmental Resources; minutes, reports, and organizational material

(1946–59) of the Pennsylvania Aeronautical Commission. Manuscripts accessioned: records (1839–1975) of the Pennsylvania Coal Company; and scrapbooks, personal correspondence, and manuscripts of novels (1950–77) of Eunice L. McCloskey.

**Rockefeller Archive Center.** Openings: records (1934–42) of the Davison Fund, Inc., established by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., to support social work in the New York City area; records (1946–68) of the American International Association for Economic and Social Development, established by Nelson A. Davis, a field member of the Rockefeller Foundation whose research dealt primarily with the epidemiology of malaria and yellow fever.

**Rosenberg Library,** Galveston, Texas. Openings: business records (1863–1929) of John Charles League (1851–1916) of Galveston, documenting League's investment in land speculation and securities during the 1920s; records of the Little Theater of Galveston (1920–32); papers of Philip C. Tucker (1826–94), Galveston attorney and leader in freemasonry; papers of Charles L. Beissner (1839–1912), commission merchant, banker, and associate of the Texas Land and Loan Company; papers of Henry Rosenberg (1824–93), banker and philanthropist. These materials have been in the possession of the library for from fifteen to fifty years, but were unavailable until processed under a National Historical Publications and Records Commission grant. Accession: miscellaneous documents, maps, charts, books, and atlases (1525–1893) describing and portraying the Gulf of Mexico, the Caribbean Sea, and adjacent coasts.

**University of Utah.** Marriott Library, Special Collections. Accessions: papers (1902–70) of Simon Bamberger (1847–1926), governor of Utah (1917–21); papers (1960–77) of Lucybeth Rampton, relating particularly to her activities in the cultural affairs of Utah; records (1883–1930) of the Holy Cross Hospital of Salt Lake City including admissions journals,

birth and death registers, surgery journals, patient's account books, account books for railroad and mine employees

and minutes of the Board of Governors' meetings; records (1877–1978) of the Ladies' Literary Club of Salt Lake City.
