# Writings for Archivists: 1989

**Editor's note:** This bibliography of books and articles related to archives published during 1989 follows the format established for the 1988 bibliography (*American Archivist*, 53:4, Fall 1990, 588–665). It is divided into two broad categories, “Writings Related to Archival Theory and Practice” and “Descriptions of Archival Holdings”; the latter, which is limited to repository guides, multi-institutional guides and directories, and descriptive essays at and above the repository level, is far less comprehensive in coverage than the former. Citations in each section are arranged alphabetically by author. The accompanying index provides subject access to the 1,184 citations; it also includes names of additional authors in the case of jointly authored works.

The slightly modified title, “Writings for Archivists,” better reflects the scope of coverage, for many of the cited works are not literally “writings *on* archives” (or by archivists) so much as work relevant to some aspect of the archival endeavor. This is particularly true for areas such as authority control, automation, electronic records, preservation, and standards, where developments are distinctly interdisciplinary and interprofessional in nature.

This bibliography, like its immediate predecessor, is derived fully from the work of the staff of the National Archives Library and its Archives Library Information Center (ALIC). They drew the citations from the library's own holdings and from extensive online bibliographic searching. The Society of American Archivists gratefully acknowledges the willingness of the National Archives and ALIC to provide a copy of the ProCite database which was manipulated to produce this published bibliography.

With the anticipated publication of “Writings for Archivists: 1990” two issues hence, we will have returned to the planned schedule of presenting in each Fall issue the listing of writings for the previous calendar year.
